Calls for Service

The Hebron Police Department responds to every call for service (CFS) received, covering 3.07 Square Miles. A Call Record (CR), is then completed for every call for service. The level of service required once on scene determines if any subsequent report is necessary.

Depending upon the nature of the call, the subsequent reporting may include a traffic crash report, a NIBRS report (National Incident Based Reporting System), or a traffic citation.

Offense Reports

Every call for service that involves an alleged or suspected criminal act results in the generation of a NIBRS report. NIBRS is the acronym for National Incident Based Reporting System which is a standardized form utilized nationwide for reporting and recording the commission of a criminal offense. A NIBRS report is a very detailed reporting format which provide for the collection of data in a format that can be readily reported to state and federal agencies for tracking and monitoring offenses. 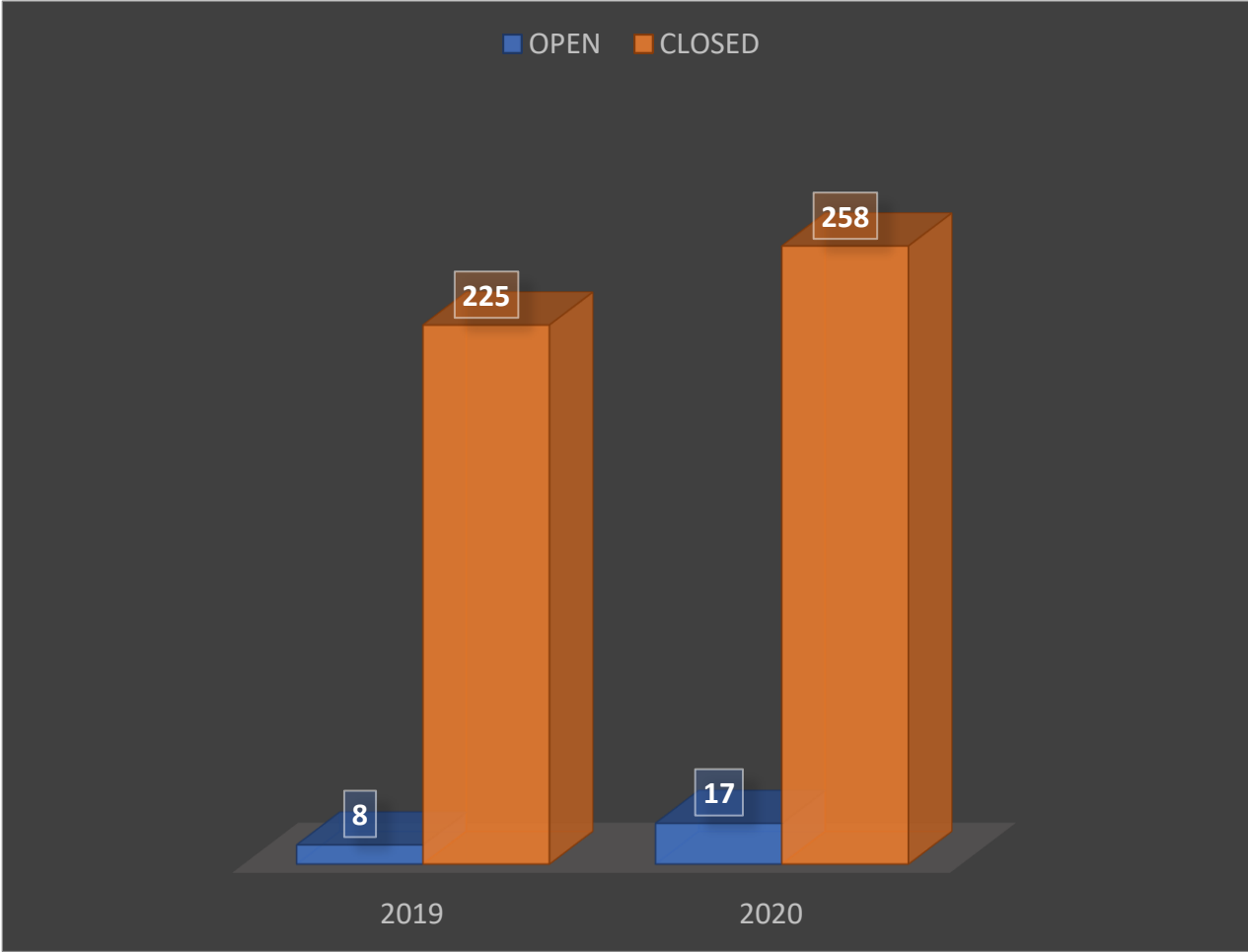

Criminal Cases (NIBRS Reports)

In 2020, 275 (NIBRS) offense reports were filed by the Hebron Police Department, and of those 258 have been closed by a number of means, including an arrest, unfound(no charges, warranted), prosecution declined, victim refused to cooperate, or by “other means.”

Other means would include those circumstances where a mutual agreement is reached between the victim and the offender, it is a suicide or accidental death, or a missing/runaway is located.

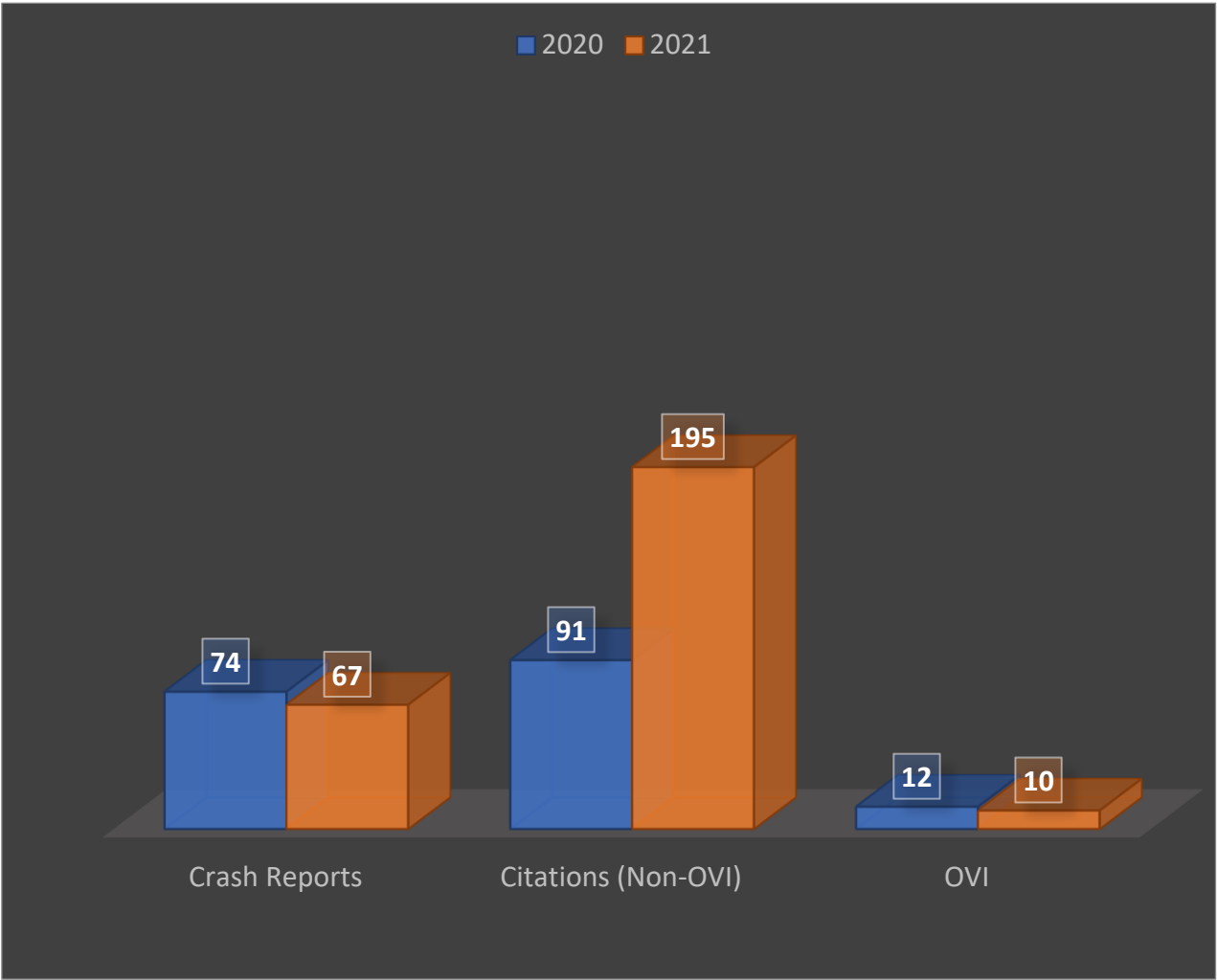


Traffic Enforcement

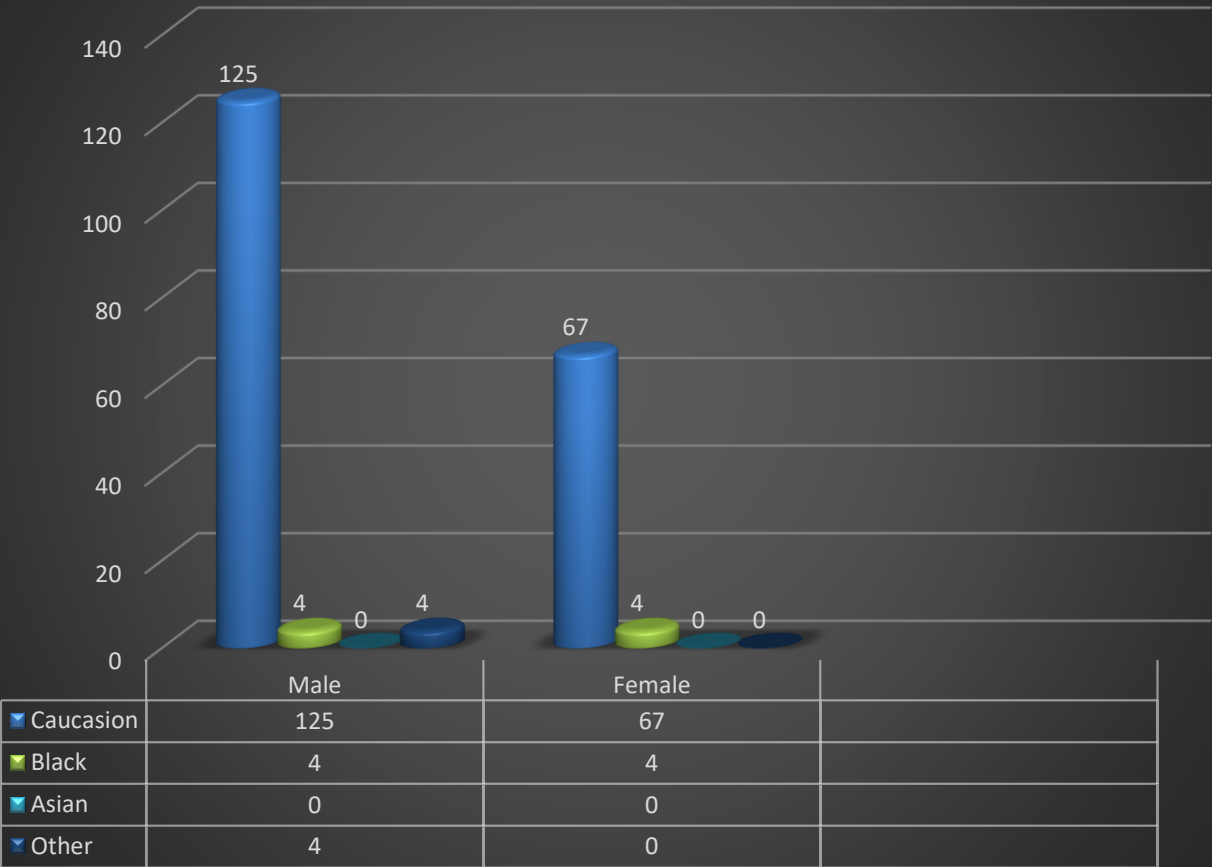
